

Middleburg and Upperville History

Middleburg was established in 1787 when it was purchased for \$2.50 an acre from a first cousin of George Washington. The town was so named for it's central location between Alexandria and Winchester and served as a resting point for travelers along the Ashby Gap trading route, which is now known as Route 50. Middleburg also served as a meeting spot for Confederate John Mosby and his Rangers and was the site of two Civil War skirmishes.

Upperville is home to the annual Colt and Horse Show, America's oldest and one of the most prestigious of its kind, which dates back to 1853.






Banbury Cross Reserve


